Here are some fun ideas from the pack to get you started in Sharing during 2012!

Share your celebrations:

Hold a special centenary event and invite current members, former Girl Guides, local supporters, friends and families to hear about what you have been doing to celebrate over the past three years, and what you are looking forward to doing in the next 100 years. Invite members to share their celebrations, their dreams, and their memories. Create a montage with photographs, artwork and descriptions of all you have done to celebrate 100 years of changing lives

Share your story:

Invite someone in, or get one of your members to talk about how they have changed lives through Girl Guiding and Girl Scouting or how their lives have been changed through Girl Guiding and Girl Scouting

Share Guiding with someone new

Hold an open night when members can invite their friends to a special centenary evening. Why not invite everyone to wear a costume, perhaps around the theme of 100 years, so they could wear an old Girl Guide/Girl Scout uniform, or something taken from the last 100 years of fashion.

Do something you can't

Try out something new this week and then tell everyone about it at your next unit meeting.

Share why Guiding is Great

Share reasons why you think Girl Guiding is great. Sit in a circle and each take turns to say "Girl Guiding is great because...". The next person has to repeat what was said before and add their own ideas. Or you can start with the phrase 'A Girl Guide is...'

Share your Photographs

Bring in a photograph of when you were a Spark, or a Brownie, and see if other members can recognise each other in their photos.

Repair and Save and Share

Repair a toy or an item of clothing instead of buying a replacement. Hold a swap after you have finished repairing your item,
