Safe Guide Important Links-

Safe Guide Updates:

- An email informing all Members of this summer's updates was sent on July 22nd. If you were one of many that did not receive the email: the link to the updates is <http://forms.girlguides.ca/SafeGuide/SitePages/Home.aspx>. The National office is aware of the problem.
- As of today the following new forms must be used/submitted for activities.
- **The SG.3** now asks for iMIS numbers of all supervisors of the event.
- **The SG.4** has one change on page two. No longer does the form ask for the phone number of the Provincial Office: it now reads "provincial emergency contact for GGC. The number to insert is the Provincial Commissioner's cell phone.
- **Third Party Service Providers** (page 69 in the July 2011 Safe Guide): the order of the four questions you are to answer is changed. This change should make this much easier to understand.
- There are two new definitions: Trip Lead and Trip Assist. Adventure trips on land and water (backpacking, canoeing etc.). Safe Guide now outlines the experience required of supervisors on such trips: see pages 14, 25, 26 and 81.
- **Safe Guide Forms: assessor@albertagirlguides.com is the only e-mail address to send your Safe Guide forms for assessment. If you do not receive an email confirming receipt of your forms within two business days you must follow up immediately by calling 780 424 5510 ext 104. **Your event cannot proceed if your forms arrive after the deadlines stated in Safe Guide.****

Member Zone Documents

Having problems downloading documents from Member Zone? The following is an explanation from the IT team at National:

- *The documents on Member Zone are only compatible with **Office 2003 or better** and will not support any lower or earlier versions. They are working to convert all word files into fillable PDFs as they have a wider range and tolerance for old software.*
- **Minimum browser requirements:** Microsoft Internet Explorer 7 or higher, Firefox 3 or higher, Chrome or Safari
- *It is highly recommended that everyone should upgrade their Internet browsers to the latest version for their own safety, security and ability while surfing the Internet. Most probably don't even know what they are missing or risk using old software versions. A note, many sites consider Internet Explorer 7 obsolete.*
