Snowman Cookie Jar


- 1 empty coffee can with lid
- 1 large sheet of light blue craft foam
- 1 sheet each of red, orange and dark blue card stock
- 2 sheets of white card stock
- 1 sheet of yellow card stock (thin enough to go through your printer)
- 12 inch length of gold decorative string
- Craft glue gun
- Safety scissors
- Cellophane tape
- Your favourite cookie recipe
- Plastic sandwich bags


HOW TO DO IT

- Cut a piece of light blue craft foam to measure 16 ½ inches by 8 ¼ inches. Wrap it around the outside of the coffee canister and secure with a craft glue gun.
- Use the Snowy Hills template to cut two pieces of white card stock. Wrap them around the bottom of the canister and secure with a craft glue gun.
- Print out the snowman template.
- Cut out the snowman from the template using the appropriate colors of card stock.
- Glue the snowman to the canister.
- Use a red permanent marker to write "Cookies" on the white craft foam snow strip.

Snowy Hills Template





This can also be done for valentines day. Just use these templates. With Pink red or white craft foam

- Print out the templates.
- Cut a piece of red 2 mm craft foam to measure 18.5 inches wide by 6.5 inches high. Cut a second piece to measure 1.5 inches wide by 6.5 inches high.
- With a craft glue gun, glue the red craft foam pieces around the canister.
- Cut out different sized hearts from pink, red and white 2 mm craft foam.
- Glue pink and white hearts around the canister with a craft glue gun.
- Cut out the arrow pieces from 6 mm thick pink craft foam.
- Line up the arrow pieces on either side of the canister and secure with a craft glue gun.
- Glue red and white hearts to either side of Cupid's arrow.
